Since 1995 Ben-Meir actively participated in the Israeli-Syrian negotiations and over the past few years he has provided several position papers to advance the Arab Israeli peace process. In each case he engaged top officials of the respective countries. Among some of his recent activity:

- Promoted the involvement of Turkey in the Israeli Palestinian conflict by establishing a comprehensive ceasefire.
- Attempted to bridge the gap between the Palestinian Authority under the late Yassir Arafat and the Sharon government.
- Provided the rationale for the resumption of the negotiations between Israel and Syria.
- Provided the argument to persuade the Arab League to pressure the Palestinians to accept the Saudi Initiative in their meeting in 2006 Khartoum, Sudan.
- Renewed his efforts in this regard by providing a position paper articulating the rationale for incorporating UN resolution 242 to the Arab Initiative to make more acceptable to the Israelis while arguing the importance of getting the Palestinian to accept it.
- Presented a position paper to Israeli officials that argue in favor of accepting the restatement in Riyadh of the Arab Initiative.

MANUSCRIPTS

Ben-Meir, Alon. *Lost Perspectives* (Book in revision – to be published in summer 2007).

This book is a compilation of articles and essays that were written about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the many opportunities that both sides have missed to achieve peace. *Lost Perspectives* demonstrate how the two sides operated at cross purposes failing to understand each other basic requirements to reconcile their differences. The author offers in several concluding pieces a way out of the dangerously deteriorating conflict.

Ben-Meir, Alon. *Promoting Democracy in Egypt without Upheaval*. (Major essay to be submitted in fall 2007).

This essay is based on the author repeated visits to Egypt and extensive research and interviews with government officials, academic, journalist, opposition leaders and ordinary people. The basic premise of the essay suggest that it will be a mistake to pressure Egypt to adopt comprehensive political reforms without concurrently focusing on four basic requirements: Gradualism, sustainable participatory developments, developing liberal institutions and revamping of the educational system; all of which require massive economic aid similar to the Marshall plan.

Ben-Meir, Alon. *Defeating Terrorism* (Book in progress – to be published in winter 2008).

This book challenges the premise that terrorism can be defeated with military means alone. In this book the author demonstrates that the United States has failed to identify the root-causes of international terrorism and thereby failed to develop effective policies to address them. The book identifies six major root-causes and provides policy recommendation to tackle them.
